## Key Stage 2 Results - 2023

On this page you can find the following results and scores:

- the percentage of children who achieved the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths
- the percentage of children who achieved a high level of attainment in Reading, Writing and Maths

### Coten End Primary School – children who achieved the expected standard:

The table below shows the percentage of children who achieved at least the expected standard at the end of Year 6 in Reading, Writing, Maths, RWM (Reading, Writing and Maths combined) and GPS (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling). The school's percentages can be compared with Warwickshire and the national averages from 2023. **In 2023, the percentage of children, from Coten End, who achieved at least the expected standard was above the national average in every subject – and all subjects combined.**

### Coten End Primary School – children who achieved a high level of attainment:

The table below shows the percentage of children who achieved a high level of attainment (or 'Greater Depth within the Expected Standard') at the end of Year 6 in Reading, Writing, Maths, RWM (Reading, Writing and Maths combined) and GPS (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling). The school's percentages can be compared with the national averages, from 2022 (as the 2023 data has not been released yet). **In 2023, the percentage of children, from Coten End, who achieved a high level of attainment was above the national average in every subject – and all subjects combined.**

### **How is Progress Measured?**

The average progress score for each subject is zero. To calculate a child's progress in one subject, their raw score in a subject's tests will be converted into a 'scaled score' (from 80-120).

Each child is placed in a PAG (Prior Attainment Group) based on their average standard in Reading, Writing and Maths. Each of these groups will then have a predicted scaled score in Year 6. The child's progress score, in each subject, will be determined by whether the score was greater, or less than, the predicted score; each child will receive either a positive or negative progress score, in each subject. All of Coten End's children's progress scores are then averaged; then the school subsequently is given a progress score for each subject (which effectively shows how children, in each school, have performed against their peers, for whom their starting points in Year 2 were similar, in each subject).

### **Coten End's progress:**

The table below shows Coten End's average progress scores in Reading, Writing and Maths. **In 2023, the children's average progress scores were above the national average in Reading, Writing and Maths.** The national average progress score in each subject is zero.
